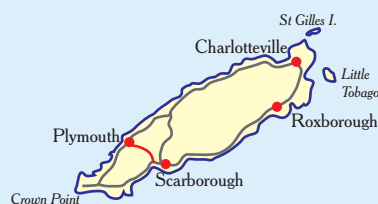

# Introduction

The European Union Delegation to Trinidad and Tobago was officially opened in 1976. Located in Port of Spain, it is one of 140 EU Delegations around the world.

The relationship between Trinidad and Tobago and the European Union (EU) has progressed from one based on development cooperation to a more comprehensive partnership that also addresses political issues, security, economic and trade relations, and other areas of mutual interest between the two partners in national development.

This publication highlights select projects and programmes of this deepening and increasingly important partnership. Enhanced cooperation between the EU and Trinidad and Tobago has brought benefits to the business, agriculture and health sectors and boosted the nation's progress through support to infrastructure development, crime and security, as well as protection of the environment and human rights.

# OVERVIEW

This publication provides both a pictorial and referential overview of the development cooperation programmes managed by the European Delegation in Trinidad and Tobago in partnership with the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago, during the period 2000-2020. Included is a sample of the programmes financed under the 9th, 10th and 11th European Development Funds (EDFs), as well as thematic budget lines for Human Rights and Civil Society Organizations. Also included are programmes funded under the regional portfolio that were managed by the Delegation.

Under successive EDFs, National Indicative Programmes (NIPs) were developed in order to provide strategic guidance for programme implementation. These NIPs were prepared after consultation with stakeholders from the Government, civil society, EU member states and other partners, and were signed by the National Authorizing Officer (NAO) who represents the Government. Regional programmes were signed with the Caribbean Forum (CARIFORUM).

## ALLOCATIONS AND FOCAL AREAS

Records indicate that, since the commencement of the 1976-2020 partnership between the EU and the Government and people of Trinidad and Tobago, grant allocations totalling over EUR 300 million in direct support were provided.

## THEMATIC BUDGET LINE ALLOCATIONS

### • Human Rights: EUR 0.92 Million

Support to civil society was based on the strategic priority areas of the Delegation's Human Rights and Democracy Country Strategy. These include:

- Promoting and Safeguarding Women's and Children's Rights;
- Campaigning for the Abolition of the Death Penalty;
- Improving Prison Conditions and Respect for Prisoners' Rights; and
- Combating discrimination against Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender and Intersex (LGBTI) persons.

### • Civil Society Organisation (CSO) Support: EUR 0.7 Million

Support to CSOs was also based on the EU Communication on Civil Society: Roots of Democracy and Sustainable Development. The objectives are to:

- Promote a favourable environment in which CSOs can operate;
- Promote a meaningful and structured participation of CSOs in domestic policies; and
- Increase local CSOs' capacity to perform their roles as independent development actors more effectively.

### Accompanying Measures for Sugar Protocol Countries

The EU allocated funding of EUR 75 million under the Accompanying Measures for Sugar Protocol (AMSP) Countries, Trinidad and Tobago 2007-2013, which was implemented between 2007 and 2016 and comprised two Multiannual Indicative Programmes. The annual programmes focused on divestment of the sugar industry, and on diversifying crop production and promoting economic activities other than agricultural production on the former sugar lands, such as tourism, as well as protection of the environment. Activities were focused on the Government's strategy to reduce the food import bill, reduce food price driven inflation, creating sustainable, long term productive employment in the agricultural sector and contributing to general economic diversification.

### Regional Programmes

Trinidad and Tobago also benefits from a number of regional projects which fall under the Caribbean Regional Indicative Programme (CRIP). During the period 2001-2020, allocations totalling EUR 552.5 million were provided to support regional integration and cooperation efforts among CARIFORUM member countries. The following programmes were managed by the Delegation to Trinidad and Tobago:

- Regional Radar Early Warning Network System: EUR 13.2 million from the 8th EDF
- Institutional Strengthening of CARICOM IMPACS–Component 6; Supply of Drugs: EUR 0.8 million under the 9th EDF

- The Caribbean Overseas Caribbean Territories/HIV/AIDS Programme: EUR 6 million
- 10th EDF CRIP EPA–Component 3: Progress Towards Effective and Efficient National and Regional Sanitary and Phyto Sanitary Regimes: EUR 11.7 million
- Intra ACP Agriculture Policy Programme with Focus on Caribbean and the Pacific–Caribbean component: EUR 8.5 million
- CARICOM Crime and Security Agency: Border Security: EUR 3.9 million

- Caribbean Financial Action Task Force–Strengthening of Financial Investigation Units: EUR 1.23 million
- Strengthening of Medical Laboratories (Med-Labs): EUR 7.5 million

Trinidad and Tobago institutions are also beneficiaries of intra-regional Caribbean programmes that are managed from other delegations, as well as the African, Caribbean and Pacific Group of States (ACP) secretariat.

Additionally under the 9th EDF, the non-focal area HIV/AIDS saw the introduction of both Rapid Testing methods and Antiretroviral Therapy in the country which significantly impacted both the New Infection Rate and the Mother to Child Transmission Rate. Trinidad and Tobago has also received support towards advancing economic diversification through stimulating competitive business and building an innovative society. Under the 10th EDF, project successes focused on the Single Electronic Window at the Ministry of Trade allowed Trinidad and Tobago to jump 12 spaces on the World Bank Doing Business Report in just 4 years. The report also named the country as one of the top 10 reformers in the world and the only nation in Latin America and the Caribbean to have such an achievement.

Having now finalised the programming of the 11th EDF which focusses on Support to Building an Innovative and Competitive Economy, we eagerly anticipate the reforms the country is now poised to undertake. It is my sincere hope that we can mimic our past successes and leapfrog Trinidad and Tobago to higher positions on international innovation rankings. Additionally, ongoing projects in the areas of renewable energy, and the eradication of gender-based violence are critical to helping Trinidad and Tobago realise its vision of a strong economy that is based on environmental sustainability and equal rights and opportunity for all our citizens. ## Reducing Poverty and Building Hope

**B**etween the years 2001 and 2008, the EU worked with the Government of Trinidad and Tobago on a Poverty Reduction Programme.

The Programme focused on improvements in the delivery of poverty reduction services, information-system strengthening, and reinforcing the institutional framework for poverty reduction.

Several projects were developed to address the needs of vulnerable groups and communities. The most affected at that time were identified as single female-headed households, the homeless, substance abusers, at-risk children, substance-abuse victims, women suffering from gender violence, the unemployed, and orphan children.

Secondary beneficiaries of the programme included policy makers, individuals and organisations in the public and private sectors engaged in poverty reduction activities.

To this day, the outputs of this seminal programme continue to contribute to a wide variety of state initiatives aimed at alleviating the plight of the poor and bringing hope to people and communities throughout the country.

## Accompanying Measures for Sugar Protocol Countries

A steady decline in the fortunes of the country's sugarcane industry led to a decision by the Government of Trinidad and Tobago to end cultivation of the crop in 2003. It was also decided to terminate subsidies by 2007.

Prior to this, sugarcane was the country's single most important crop and accounted for between 40% and 50% of total agricultural GDP between 1990 and 1998.

At that time, state-operated Caroni (1975) Ltd cultivated about 12,200 hectares, while private farmers cultivated some 14,200 hectares. The production of raw sugar peaked at 117,000 tonnes in 1995, and was followed by continuous reductions thereafter.

The country's long history in the industry meant that the impact of this decline was far-reaching and had broad implications for all sectors and sub-sectors of the economy.

The EU assisted in this process by allocating EUR 75 million under the Accompanying Measures for Sugar Protocol applicable to countries undergoing the same process of adjustment.

## Empowering Single Fathers

Perceptions of institutional and societal bias against fathers were the focus of a three-year research project conducted by the Single Fathers Association of Trinidad and Tobago (SFATT) and the Emancipation Support Committee.

The project, launched in 2015, researched and assessed the outcomes of child custody litigation: provided support to single fathers and their families in cases of involuntary separation from their children, and helped build the capacity of the Association to better deliver services offered.

The results of the research were both reviewed by a multi-sector committee and, in 2018, presented before a parliamentary Joint Select Committee on Human Rights, Equality and Diversity. This body of work is now being used to inform policy-making in such matters.

## Fostering A Sexual Culture of Justice

Between 2017 and 2018, the EU partnered with the Institute for Gender and Development Studies (IGDS) at The University of the West Indies (UWI) and six leading LGBTQI organisations in Trinidad and Tobago on a project designed to change public attitudes on domestic violence and discrimination against people of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer and Intersex (LGBTQI) community.

The project proposed a new “sexual culture of justice” with the Coalition Advocating for Inclusion of Sexual Orientation (CAISO), Friends for Life, I Am One, The Silver Lining Foundation, WOMANTRA, and The Women’s Caucus.

Specially-targeted stakeholders were: secondary school teachers and guidance counselors, police officers, human rights institutions, families of members of the LGBTQI community, students, community advocates, and grassroots organisations.

## Improving Weather System Monitoring

**H**urricanes and other severe weather systems have taken lives and disrupted economies and progress across the Caribbean. Early warning of severe weather is essential to protect lives and property; among other things, this requires the use of weather radars.

Between 2005 and 2010, the EU provided funding to four CARIFORUM Countries - Barbados, Belize, Guyana and Trinidad and Tobago - to commission four new Doppler radars, a regional radar communication system for radar images, training for meteorological officers, and improved access to weather data for the public.

The Caribbean Meteorological Organisation based in Trinidad and Tobago was the implementing agency.

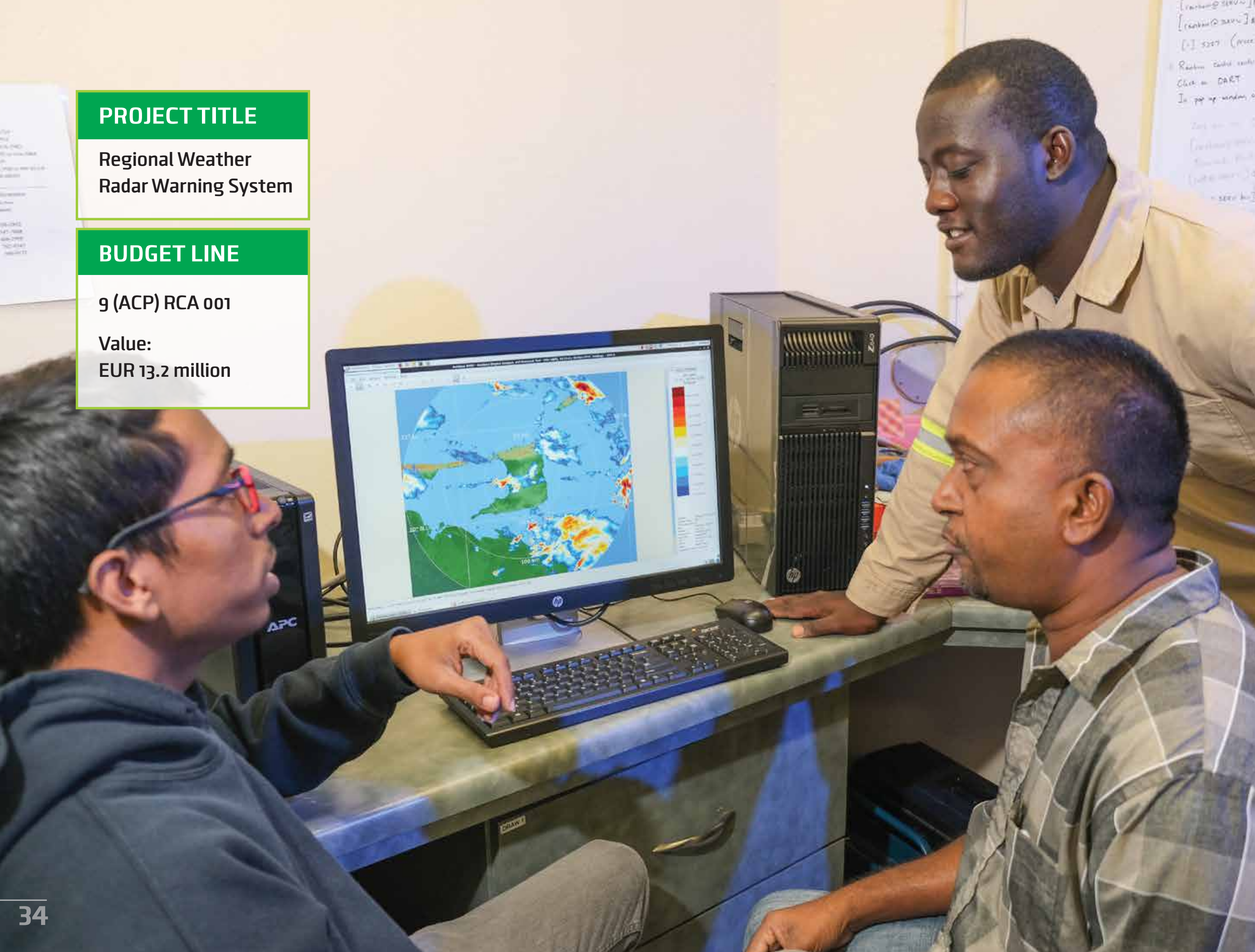

## Combating Money Laundering and Terrorism Financing

**A**s Financial Intelligence/Investigations Units (FIUs) were introduced across the Caribbean Community member states, Caribbean Financial Action Task Force (CFATF), comprising 25 countries, was set up to implement common counter-measures against money laundering and terrorism financing.

Since 2016, and with assistance from the EU, CFATF was supported to strengthen these units and worked to boost the investigative skills of financial analysts and investigators in analytical and financial intelligence units in Antigua and Barbuda, The Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, Montserrat, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname and Trinidad and Tobago.

## Ensuring An Enduring Public Health Legacy

**B**efore 2001, there was no permanent regional mechanism for standards and quality control of medical laboratories in the Caribbean which are vital to accurate testing and confirming the prevalence of diseases.

Between 2001 and 2007, the EU supported a project in 15 countries in the CARIFORUM region to help both public and private sector labs manage and co-ordinate quality assurance and cooperation.

The Caribbean Epidemiology Centre (CAREC), whose functions have now been absorbed into the work of the Caribbean Public Health Agency (CARPHA), oversaw the project on behalf of the Pan American Health Organisation (PAHO). Excellent collaboration throughout the region by both public and private labs is credited for this project's success.

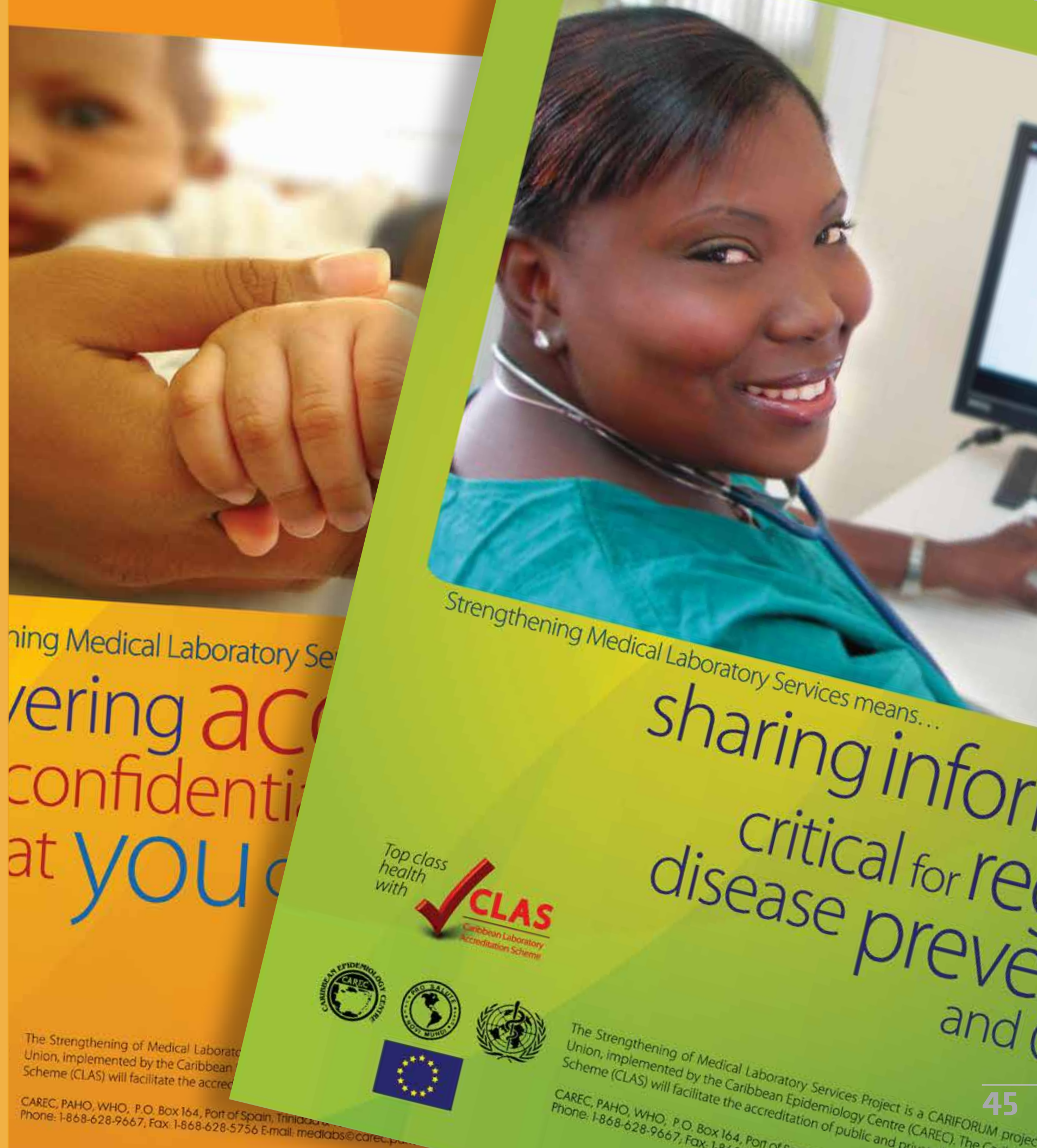

## Addressing the HIV/AIDS Challenge

The Government of Trinidad and Tobago developed a National HIV/AIDS Strategic Plan for the period 2004-2008 which structured and coordinated a national response to HIV/AIDS in five priority areas. The plan was implemented by the National AIDS Coordinating Committee.

The EU assisted in the effort by funding a project to support four of the five priority areas under the Strategic Plan and provided specific resources for Tobago.

The Plan focused on the prevention of the spread of HIV/AIDS; treatment, care and support; advocacy and human rights; programme management, coordination and evaluation; and implementation of a Tobago response to the challenge.

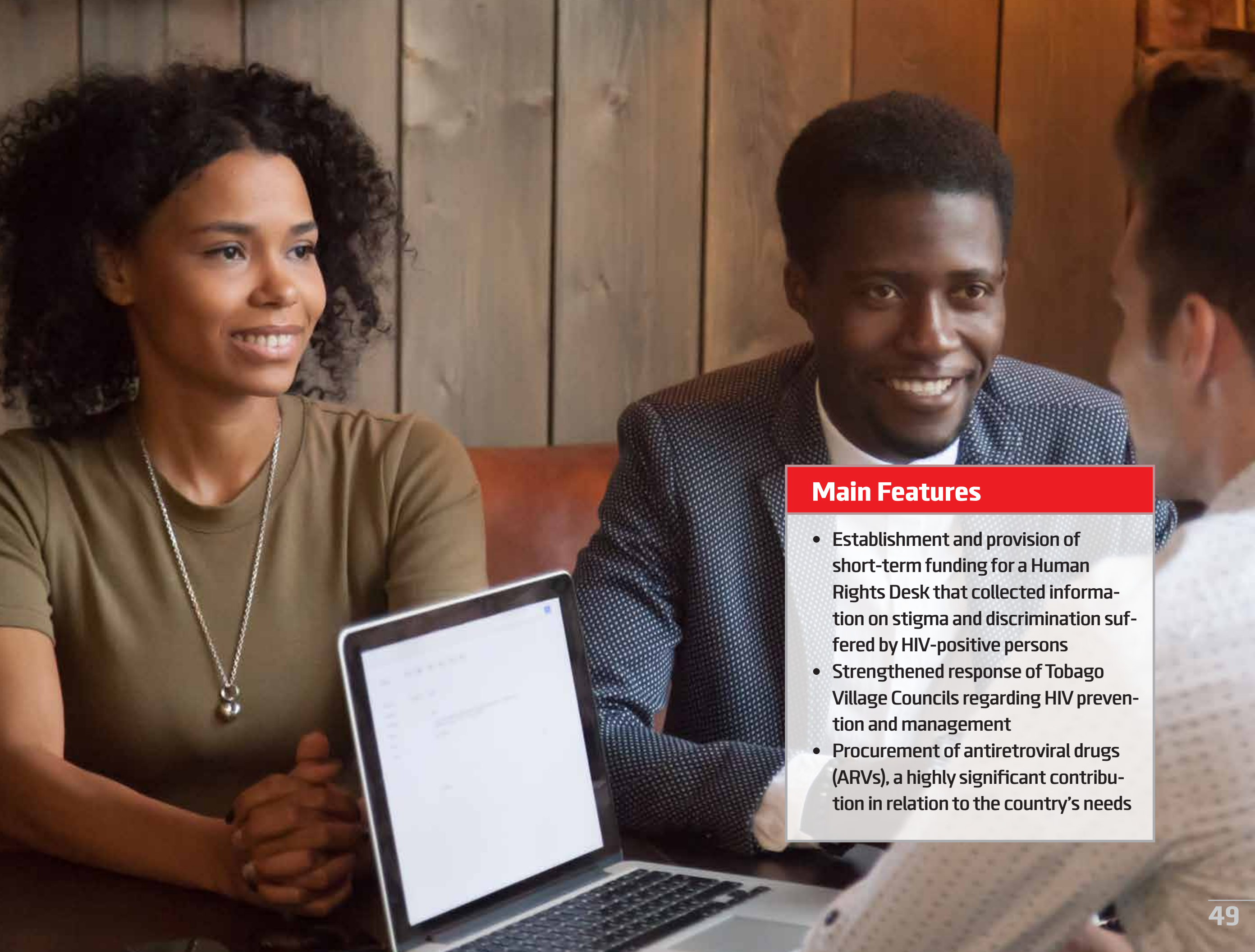

## Strengthening Parliamentary Oversight

**W**ith a focus on strengthening the work of the Parliament of Trinidad and Tobago in the areas of national budget implementation and the administration of government departments, the EU supported a study tour of parliamentarians to the United Kingdom in 2013.

The tour followed a 2012 field mission which identified the role played by Parliament in ensuring effective oversight through an assessment of the work of Joint Select Committees (JSCs). It also examined Parliament's role in the budgetary cycle.

In 2012, there was a follow-up workshop in Tobago to discuss the outcomes of the field mission and, in 2013, there was a parliamentary staff training workshop.

The 2013 UK Study Tour was funded by the EU, with support from Transtec, and took nine parliamentarians together with two staff members to Westminster, the National Assembly of Wales, and Ireland's Houses of the Oireachtas.

## Supporting Infrastructure Development

**D**uring the pre-2008 period, the EU supported a number of infrastructure projects in partnership with the Government of the Republic of Trinidad & Tobago.

This collaboration led to the development of several facilities and civil services, with the intention to encourage growth in various sectors of Trinidadian and Tobagonian society.

The results of these projects include the expansion of the Sir Solomon Hochoy Highway, construction of the Navet Dam, the development of several buildings at the University of the West Indies (UWI), St. Augustine Campus and the erection of streetlights along the North Coast Road.

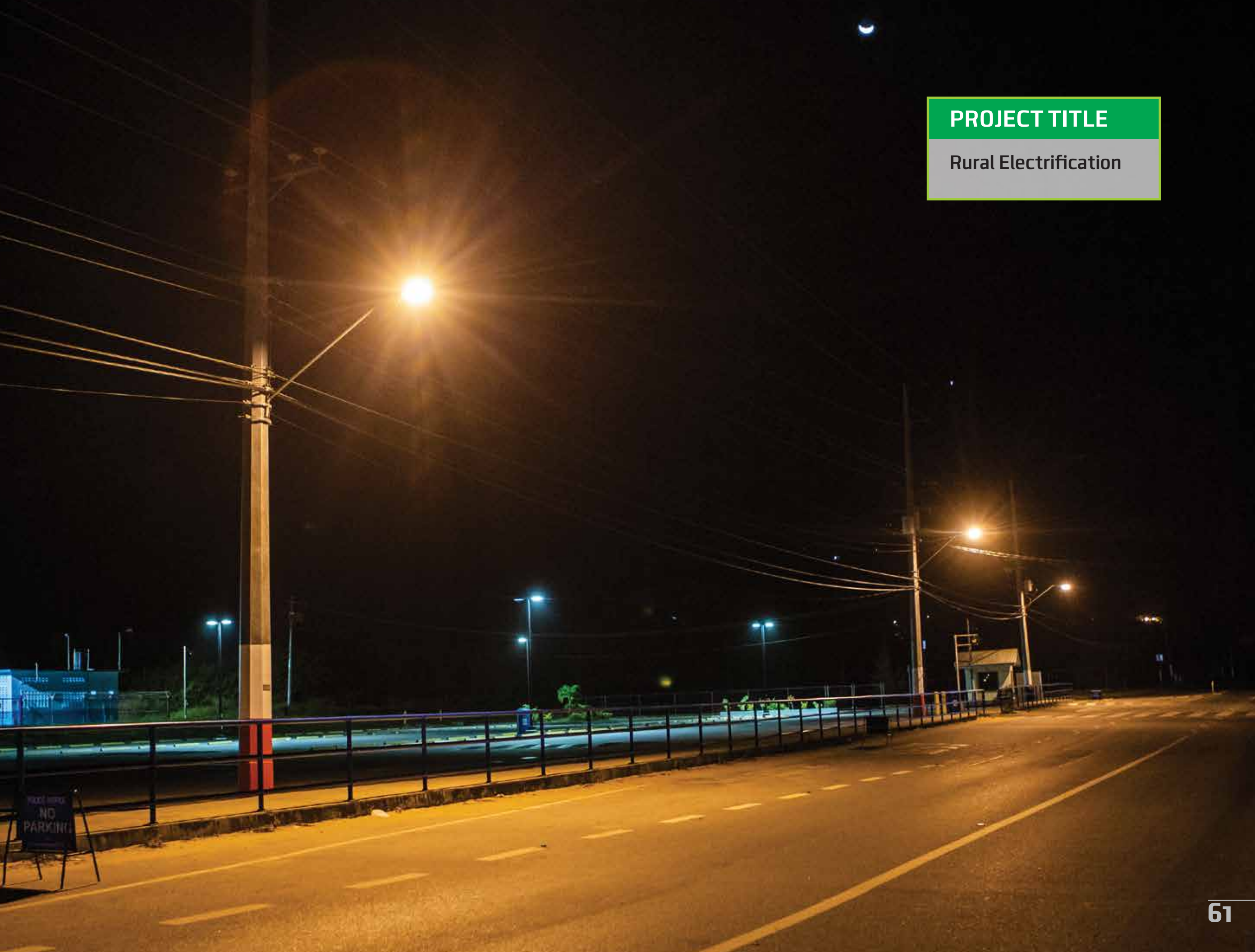

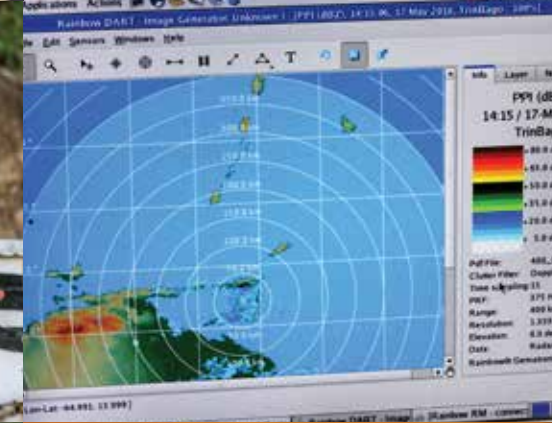

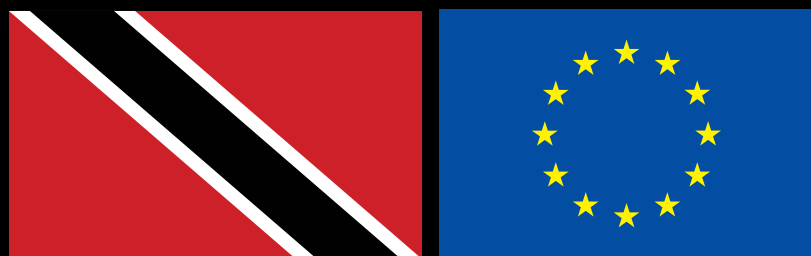
