Mozambique



The European Union (EU) and Mozambique have a longstanding partnership covering a wide range of fields, including the security and defence sector.

After the successful results of the European Union Training Mission in Mozambique (EUTM MOZ), our military partnership continues with the European Union Military Assistance Mission in Mozambique (EUMAM MOZ), launched on 1 September 2024.

EUMAM MOZ aims to ensure that the Quick Reaction Forces (QRF) units trained by EUTM Mozambique become self-sufficient, thus contributing to the creation of a safer and more secure environment in Cabo Delgado. It assists by mentoring, advising and giving specialised training.

MISSION MANDATE

EUMAM MOZ supports FADM in developing and enhancing its capabilities, to improve the sustainability of the trained QRFs to be able to operate, especially in the Cabo Delgado region, in a robust and autonomous operational cycle in accordance with International Humanitarian Law and International Human Rights Law. This includes preparation, deployment, support and the regeneration of the forces.

EUMAM MOZ has organised, in close collaboration with FADM, more **than 15 programmes**, involving more than **500 mozambican military personnel** in different areas, namely logistics, mentoring, leadership, legal, gender advising, civil-Military cooperation, communication.

EUMAM MOZ is built on EUTM (2021-2024) Mozambique's successes, which included achievements such as:

- **Training** 11 QRF units, a total of 1700 military personnel.
- **Developing and certifying** more than 100 Mozambican instructors.
- **Enhancing** the FADM counter-terrorism capabilities.
- **Promoting** adherence to human rights and international humanitarian law.
- **Supporting** efforts to protect civilians.
