- Strengthening the institutional capacity of the relevant Ghanaian government institutions.
  These include the Ministry of Gender, Child and Social Protection (MoGSCP), to establish effective coordination mechanisms.
- Effective coordination mechanisms at the decentralized level.
- Support to training institutions active in social protection education and training.
- Design of web-based Monitoring and Evaluation dashboard and M&E institutional strengthening.
- Support to legal and regulatory framework and promotion of social accountability activities.

The component of the GESP Programme has delivered the following notable results:


- A capacity development plan for a proposed Regional Social Protection Committee developed.
