


Key events related to the EU-Japan collaboration in Science, Technology and Innovation



24-27 January 2023

Top official of European Commission's Directorate-General for Research and Innovation travels to Japan

Signe Ratso, the European Commission's Acting Director-General for Research and Innovation, visited Tokyo from 24 to 27 January to discuss the possible association of Japan to Horizon Europe, the key funding programme of the European Union (EU), with relevant Japanese ministries, funding agencies and research entities. Association would represent a major leap forward in the overall EU-Japan R&I partnership, underpin the EU-Japan Strategic Partnership Agreement, the EU-Japan Green Alliance and Digital Partnership and help implement the recently signed Memorandum of Understanding on Hydrogen. On the occasion of her visit, the EU Delegation and Tohoku University co-organised a seminar in hybrid format (hybrid seminar) on opportunities for research collaboration under clusters in the Horizon Europe Work Programme 2023-24 and on the benefits of association. The event opened with remarks by EU Ambassador to Japan Jean-Eric Paquet, and was followed by addresses from by Acting DG Ratso, Japanese policymakers, and presentations. The Research Council of Norway testified to the benefits of association and also presented select Framework Programme projects.

Horizon Europe launch webinar: EU Research and Innovation Framework Programme 2021-2027

On 7 July, the Delegation hosted Horizon Europe launch webinar targeting Japanese researchers. The event provided a general introduction to the work program and explained its significance, particularly in terms of the mobility and collaboration opportunities. The webinar began with a series of welcome addresses and introductory remarks from key stakeholders in the EU and Japan, followed by presentations on Horizon Europe and the first set of calls under the Work Programme 2021-2022. The webinar was attended by around 230 participants.



Science Agora 2020



Dr. Patricia Flor, the EU Ambassador to Japan, delivered opening remarks for Science Agora, the largest STIrelated public event in Japan, hosted by the Japan Science and Technology Agency. The EU Delegation participated in this annual event for the sixth time. On 18 November, in a webinar-format session, researchers participating in Horizon 2020 projects, including those from the University of Akita University, Tokyo, Meiji University, Kyoto Seika University and the University of the Arts London, gave a series of presentations on their research outcomes and merits of multilateral collaboration. The session was livestreamed in YouTube and welcomed active interactions with the audience.

EC-AMED Implementing Arrangement

The European Commission (EC) and the Japan Agency for Medical Research and Development (AMED) signed an Implementing Arrangement which allows AMED-funded researchers to work jointly with the European Research Council (ERC) on health issues. The signing ceremony included welcome address by Dr. Patricia Flor, the EU Ambassador to Japan, opening remarks by Ms. Maria Christina Russo, Director for International Cooperation, DG Research and Innovation of the EC, and Ms. Sonoko Watanabe, Deputy Director-General of the Office of Healthcare Policy, Cabinet Secretariat, remarks by Dr. Yoshinao Mishima, President of AMED, Prof. Jean-Pierre Bouguignon, President of the ERC, and Mr. Yasushi Masaki, Ambassador of Japan to the European Union. The ceremony was concluded with a speech for a toast by Mr. Osamu Aruga, Director of International Affairs, Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT).

EU-Japan Webinar Series on COVID-19: Webinar N6. "COVID-19 & Research and Innovation"

On 17 September, the EU-Japan Webinar Series on COVID-19 on the topic of the "Research and Innovation" was held online. 
17-18 December 2019




16-17 November 2019


Tenth Anniversary of the signing of the EU-Japan Cooperation Agreement in Science and Technology

The European Innovation Day 2019 brought together the Japan-based community of innovators, individuals and institutions and provided information on opportunities for fostering innovation both in the EU and Japan. Latest developments, and future tools such as, on the EU side, the European Innovation Council, and on the Japanese side, the Moonshot project, were presented. Possibilities for increased cooperation in the field of innovation, as well as services useful to innovators interested in Europe were showcased.

Another focus of the event, and a cross-cutting priority of the EU, was gender equality in Research and Innovation. The Japanese and EU perspectives were presented, including a review of the latest statistics available at the EU level through the "She Figures 2018" study.

Photo exhibition, "Women of Mathematics: A Gallery of Portraits"



The exhibition highlighted the human aspect of mathematics and provide role models for young female scientists. It aimed at encouraging discussions about how to overcome specific obstacles often faced by women when working in the field of mathematics.

The exhibition was supported by the Mathematical Society of Japan, the Graduate School of Mathematical Sciences of the University of Tokyo, the Department of Mathematics of Keio University and the Tohoku Forum for Creativity of Tohoku University.

The tenth EU-Japan Science Policy Forum was co-organised by the Delegation of the European Union to Japan and the National Graduate Institute for Policy Studies (GRIPS). It provided an excellent opportunity for European and Japanese policymakers, funders, academics and other STI stakeholders to think about how both sides could collaborate more closely and build further bridges between their funding programmes, how to be prepared for the future and how to implement effective STI policies in a changing world. Opportunities for horizontal and thematic collaborations were discussed, such as in what ways could Horizon Europe and the 6th Science and Technology Basic Plan be linked or used to enhance cooperation between the EU and Japan.


5 June 2019




10-11 November 2018
