Living in Cilegon, Indonesia, a city with high intolerance where Christians are banned from building churches, has inspired Tito, a privileged Muslim, to found Bastra ID in 2018. This educational organisation uses literacy and socio-emotional skills to solve social problems, focusing on negotiation abilities and empathy taught through school lessons. Tito developed the "Berembug Card," a game played by 400 students in Cilegon to teach conflict resolution related to intolerance, gender inequality, bullying, and disability discrimination. This game fosters interfaith dialogue and collects data for peace policy recommendations, which will be presented to collaborators.

Bastra ID has received several awards, including the Young Southeast Asian Leaders Initiative Academic Fellowship in the United States, the International 30 Under 30 Opportunity Desk Impact, and Young Leaders for Indonesia by McKinsey & Company. Over the past five years, Tito has worked on peace issues, seeking diverse learning approaches, and enabling Bastra ID to collaborate with various national and international donors, such as Unilever Indonesia, Indika Foundation, and the US Department of State. Joining the Youth Sounding Board will allow him to empower his organisation and local policymakers, scale up the impact, find and connect mentors, develop a global network, and benchmark best practices for peacebuilding. Tito hopes to represent Indonesia, share the principles of diversity and inclusion, and create a platform for young people to voice their expertise, particularly through the Berembug Card programme.
