Events and activities organized by the EU Member States during the 16 Days of Activism campaign in Tanzania

Social media engagements in support of national campaign, Nov. 25 - Dec. 10, 2022

The Embassy of Denmark, the Embassy of Belgium and the Embassy of the Netherlands are supporting WILDAF, the coordinator of the campaign, and will participate in social media engagements to raise awareness about the campaign and motivate every individual to take part in ending GBV.

Finnish social media campaign addressing GBV, Nov. 25 - Dec. 10, 2022

The Embassy of Finland will launch a social media campaign, which will serve as a platform for local, international and Finnish partners to show how their development cooperation projects have influenced women's lives in Tanzania by empowering women and hampering GBV in different ways.

Media campaign and coverage by the Swedish Embassy, Nov. 25 - Dec. 10, 2022

The Embassy of Sweden will support LaunchPad's social media campaign to address GBV as well as a series of community activities focused on positive masculinity and a national Women Leadership Summit organized by its partner organization TGNP. On Dec. 10, the Embassy will give remarks on behalf of development partners at an LHRC-coordinated event in commemoration of the Human Rights Day.

Launch of 16 Days of Activism Campaign in Zanzibar, Nov. 25, 2022

The Ministry of Gender will organize a high-level event in Zanzibar to officially launch the national campaign. A wide range of stakeholders, including government officials, development partners, and NGOs, will deliver solidarity messages on GBV through music, art, and theater. The Guest of Honor is the First Lady of Zanzibar H. E. Mariam Mwinyi. The event will take place at Idris Abdulwakil Hall from 8 am – 12 noon. At 2:30 pm, the Ministry will launch a 5-day awareness campaign on ending harassment and sexual violence in public spaces in Kisonge Marketplace which will be attended by the Minister of Community Development, Gender and Children Hon. Dr. Dorothy Gwajima.











Media campaign on danger of human trafficking and workshop, Nov. 29, 2022

The EU Delegation will support a media campaign in Zanzibar to raise women and girls awareness about the danger of human trafficking. The campaign will be preceded by a preparatory workshop on 29 November, gathering key stakeholders to discuss the modalities of human trafficking, especially trafficking of women and girls for sexual and labor exploitation.

> Interactive dialogue on GBV prevention and response mechanisms, Dec. 2, 2022

The Embassy of Ireland will host an interactive dialogue entitled "The Power Within" from 8am to 1pm at the Protea Courtyard Hotel in Dar es Salaam. The purpose of the event is to provide a platform for insights and experiences in preventing and responding to GBV. It will bring together a diverse range of voices, activists and partners to discuss the drivers of gender inequality/violence against women as well as concrete policy recommendations. There will also be artistic performances and graphic recording throughout.

Film screening at Alliance Française, Dec. 5, 2022

The Embassy of France invites you to join the screening of the film "In The Name Of Your Daughter" which addresses female genital mutilation (FGM) in Tanzania at Alliance Française at 6 pm. The screening will be followed by a debate with Ms. Rhobi Samwelly, gender activist and founder of "Hope for Girls and Women," and members of her NGO.

> The role of law and arts in the prevention of and response to GBV, Dec 5, 2022

On December 5, the Ministry of Constitutional and Legal Affairs, together with GIZ and the Law School of Tanzania and in collaboration with the Bagamoyo Institute of Arts and Culture, will host a gathering bringing together a diverse set of stakeholders and students to explore the role which law and arts can play in the prevention of and response to GBV and to generate ideas for strengthening legal aid and human rights education in Tanzania.

Women's Voice concert at Alliance Française, Dec. 7, 2022

The Embassy of France will host a Women's Voice concert featuring Tanzanian female hiphop artists at Alliance Française at 7 pm.

Choreography performed by Tanzanian dancers, Dec. 8, 2022

The Embassy of Spain, in partnership with Muda Africa, will present "Unsafe at home", a choreography by Estel López and performed by Tanzanian female dancers. It will take place at Muda Kona on Thursday, December 8. The piece reflects on the impact of GBV not only on women's bodies, but also on other unnoticeable aspects of their lives.













The choreography depicts the way bodies interact in search of support, mutual listening, and empathy.

Workshop on gender equality and GBV in the newsroom, Dec. 8, 2022

On December 8, the German Embassy in collaboration with Deutsche Welle Akademie (DWA) and their partner organizations The Launchpad Tanzania and Media Convergency will host two journalist workshops titled: "Gender equality and GBV in the newsroom – what can media houses do to support and protect female journalists?" The workshop targets 30 digital media and radio content producers both from rural and urban areas of Tanzania.

Film screening at the Goethe Institut, Dec. 12, 2022

The Embassy of Spain and the EU Delegation will screen the movie "Las Niñas" (Schoolgirls) at the Goethe Institut on Monday, December 12. It is a 2020 Spanish coming-of-age drama film written and directed by Pilar Palomero. Standing on the threshold of adolescence, Celia turns her mute acceptance of authority into a thirst for life in all its multifaceted glory. In small acts of rebellion, Celia finds the courage to express her growing distrust of the value system governing her world in 1990s Spain. The film won the Goya Award for Best Film, along with Best New Director and Best Original Screenplay for Pilar Palomero, and Best Cinematography for Daniela Cajías, from a total of nine nominations, at the 35th Goya Awards.
