Mission of the Delegation

The Delegation of the European Union in Riyadh was officially opened in 2004. With the Lisbon Treaty and the setup of a unified diplomatic service (European External Action Service), it is representing the EU as a whole and speaking on behalf of the Member States where there is unanimous agreement on foreign policy areas.

The EU Delegation is accredited to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, the Sultanate of Oman, the Kingdom of Bahrain and the Gulf Cooperation Council Secretariat. The Delegation deals with political relations, economic and trade cooperation, energy, climate change, cultural cooperation, security, space and being a consular focal point.

Cultural Relations

The Delegation introduces European culture and facilitates cultural exchanges between Europeans and Saudis in various fields such as film, music, art and education, including through the organisation of cultural events. The Cultural institutes and embassies of Austria, Czech Republic, France, Italy, Spain and the Goethe-Institute established in 2021 the European Union National Institutes of Culture (EUNIC) cluster in Saudi Arabia. The EU Delegation actively supports the cluster's work as the main strategic partner. This cultural network, which already operates in more than 90 countries worldwide, aims at strengthening Saudi-European cultural ties and supporting the exchange.



Erasmus +

For over 30 years, Europe has funded the Erasmus programme, which has enabled over 4 million European students to study, train and gain experience abroad. Now Erasmus+ opportunities are also open to the Gulf region with individual students able to apply for scholarships to study in Europe, as well as universities in Saudi Arabia able to establish partnerships with their European peers, to perform student and staff exchanges.
