Learning new languages is fun!

The European Year of Languages 2001, jointly organised by the Council of Europe and the European Union, was successful in involving millions of people across 45 participating countries. Its activities celebrated linguistic diversity in Europe and promoted language learning. The linguistic diversity is a great tool for achieving greater intercultural understanding and a key element in the rich cultural heritage. Therefore, the Council of Europe, in Strasbourg, promotes plurilingualism in the whole of Europe. Following the success of the Year of Languages, the Council of Europe declared a European Day of Languages to be celebrated on 26th of September each year.

The general objectives of the European Day of Languages are:

- Alerting the public to the importance of language learning and
- diversifying the range of languages learnt in order to increase plurilingualism and intercultural understanding;
- Promoting the rich linguistic and cultural diversity of Europe, which must be preserved and fostered;
- Encouraging lifelong language learning in and out of school, whether for study purposes, for professional needs, for purposes of mobility or for pleasure and exchanges.

Facts about languages:

There are between 6000 and 7000 languages in the world - spoken by 7 billion people divided into 189 independent states.

At least half of the world's population are bilingual or plurilingual, i.e. they speak two or more languages.

Bilingualism brings with it many benefits: it makes the learning of additional languages easier, enhances the thinking process and fosters contacts with other people and their cultures.

Bilingualism and plurilingualism entail economic advantages, too: jobs are more easily available to those who speak several languages, and multilingual companies have a better competitive edge than monolingual ones.

Due to the influx of migrants and refugees, Europe has become largely multilingual. In London alone some 300 languages are spoken (Arabic, Turkish, Kurdish, Berber, Hindi, Punjabi, etc.).



Learning English Language in Sudan

The English language is taught through courses provided by the British Council in Sudan. In parallel, English Language is taught as part of the Sudanese curriculum starting at primary all the way up to university. The British Council offers 4 terms a year covering general English Courses, IELTS preparation courses, Young Learners courses and professional courses. The council employs over 30 teachers, in addition to various English Language centers offering courses around Khartoum.
