## College of Europe Natolin Campus in Warsaw

The College of Europe, with its two campuses (Bruges, founded in 1949 and Natolin in 1992), is the oldest and most prestigious institute of postgraduate European studies. It attracts students from all over the world who are seeking a truly multicultural experience and an international career.

The Natolin campus is located in Warsaw, the capital of one of the largest EU member states in East Central Europe. It was established in 1992 in anticipation of the eastern enlargement of the EU, and today it specialises in the study of new developments in the European Union, its relations with its nearest nei-

ghbours and recent European History. Its students all study a unique interdisciplinary MA programme, which consists of courses covering the legal, economic, geopolitical and historical foundations of European integration, and offers further specialisations depending on students' preferences.

In addition, it is home to the European Neighbourhood Policy Chair and the European Civilisation Chair. This makes it particularly attractive to students wishing to specialise in the EU's external relations in its neighbourhood as well as its historical and cultural development.

- Applications are invited from students holding (or about to achieve) a good Master's degree (in some countries rules differ – please check our website)
- Natolin students are often graduates in Economics, Law or Political Science but we also welcome graduates in History, Communication Studies, Languages, Philosophy, Philology and, more exceptionally, in other unrelated subjects if students show high interest in our offer
- The working languages are English and French - applicants should have a B2 minimum level for one working language and an A2 minimum level for the other
- Applications for the following academic year open in November and usually close in the middle of January
